Bible 101

During Lent, Lynn will be leading a Bible study on **Tuesday** evenings (February 28, March 7, 14, 21, 28 and April 4). The study will be an overview of the Bible --what's in it and where, how it came to be, why it matters, how to study it, and more. It will be a quick trip in just five weeks, but you'll get tools and insights that will help you dig deeper on your own. And you might get a couple of songs to help you learn the books of the Bible in order.

Resources for Lent

The season of Lent begins this Wednesday. There are several resources available for you during this Lenten season. One is a devotional booklet on the theme "Redeemed" published by the Society of St. Andrew. There is a short devotional, scripture reading, and prayer for every day of Lent. A second resource is a Lenten calendar focusing on the theme "Journey to Jerusalem." Daily scripture readings from Luke's gospel let you read through the end of Jesus' ministry -- from the moment he "sets his face to go to Jerusalem" to his entry into Jerusalem. On that calendar are the services we will be having during Lent and Holy Week, program topics for Wednesday nights, etc. The booklet and calendar are available outside the sanctuary opposite the CE office.

Mardi Gras, Fat Tuesday, Shrove Tuesday...Pancakes!

The day before Ash Wednesday has several names. Shrove Tuesday comes from the word "shrive," which refers to the practice of confessing one's sins and being given absolution. Fat Tuesday comes from the practice of using all the fats in one's house ahead of Lent's fasting. Mardi Gras is the literal French translation of Fat Tuesday. Whatever you call it, we'll celebrate with a Pancake Supper on Tuesday, February 21 at 6 p.m. in the Family Life Center. And if you haven't had enough sugar after your pancakes, we'll have a fire set up for making s'mores, too!

Our task is to serve as docents, or ushers, in the house of wonder: escorting our people with humility, respect, and reverence to the threshold of the holy, and opening doors to awareness of the presence of God in all of life.
