#### THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

**April 2, 1978**: Episcopal Canon Mary Simpson of New York speaks from the pulpit of Westminster Abbey in London, the first ordained woman to preach there.

**April 5, 1803**: The first complete performance of Beethoven's oratorio Christ on the Mount of Olives takes place in Vienna.

**April 5, 1956**: East German authorities dynamite ruins of the Ulrich church in Magdeburg, despite Christian protests. Religious leaders' plans to rebuild the historic sanctuary are ignored. It dates back to 1023 but has been damaged in the war.
