THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

March 13, 452: Roman Emperor Marcian issues an edict against the Eutychians, who taught that Christ's divine nature absorbed his human nature, making him one person with one nature rather than one person with two natures (fully human and fully divine).

March 15, 1411: Reformer Jan Hus, whose work influenced Martin Luther, is excommunicated for his preaching against the greed and immorality of the clergy and the superstitious practices of the church. In addition, the excommunication document also punished the people of Prague (where Hus preached) by forbidding them to receive the sacraments.


