THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

June 29, 325: In A.D. 312, Constantine won control of the Roman Empire and elevated Christianity to favored status in the empire. "One God, one Lord, one faith, one church, one empire, one emperor" became his motto. The new emperor soon discovered that "one faith and one church" were fractured by theological disputes, especially conflicting understandings of the nature of Christ. Arius, a priest of the church in Alexandria, asserted that Christ was created by God and therefore was similar to God but not of the same "substance" as God. Arius was opposed by the bishop, Alexander, and his associate and successor, Athanasius. They affirmed that the divinity of Christ, the Son, is of the same substance as the divinity of God, the Father. To say anything else, they argued, was to open the possibility of polytheism, and to imply that knowledge of God in Christ was not final knowledge of God. To counter a widening rift within the church, Constantine convened a council in Nicaea in A.D. 325. A creed reflecting the position of Alexander and Athanasius was written and signed by a majority of the bishops on or around June 19. Nevertheless, the two parties continued to battle each other. In 381, a second council met in Constantinople. It adopted a revised and expanded form of the A.D. 325 creed, now known as the Nicene Creed.

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WE ARE THE PEOPLE OF A LOVING GOD, GATHERING, GROWING, GIVING, AND GOING TO SERVE,

From within this holy circle, this house of love, the mystery of God is revealed to us. It is the mystery of the three angels who appeared at the Oak of Mamre, who ate the meal Sarah and Abraham generously offered to them and who announced the unexpected birth of Isaac... This angelic appearance is the prefiguration of the divine mission by which God sends us the only Son. The tree of Mamre becomes the tree of life, the house of Abraham becomes the dwelling place of God-with-us and the mountain becomes the spiritual heights of prayer and contemplation. The lamb that Abraham offered to the angels becomes the sacrificial lamb...at the center of the icon. The hands of the Father, Son, and Spirit reveal in different ways its significance. The Son, in the center, points to it with two fingers, indicating his mission to become the sacrificial lamb. The Father, on the left, encourages the Son with a blessing gesture. And the Spirit, who holds the same staff of authority as the Father and the Son, signifies by pointing to the rectangular opening in the front of the altar that this divine sacrifice is a sacrifice for the salvation of the world.
