## THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

**June 5, 1965:** Death in London, England, of Eleanor Farjeon. She authored the popular hymn "Morning Has Broken."

**June 6, 1900:** Li Chouzi, an ardent Christian girl, and all the other Chinese Christians of her village are hacked to death by revolutionaries known as Boxers.

**June 7, 1683:** The *Concord* sets sail, carrying the first German settlers (Quakers and Mennonites fleeing persecution) toward their new home in Pennsylvania.

**June 9, 597:** Death of Columba of Iona, influential Irish missionary to England. He had founded several monasteries which served as centers of faith and learning.

Undertaking to explain the Trinity can be a daunting task. A legend (based on nothing written by Augustine) says that while Augustine was wrestling with the writing called *De Trinitate* (About The Trinity) he had a vision. Augustine was

by the seashore when he saw a child with a seashell (some sources say a spoon). The child had dug a hole in the sand and was running between the ocean and a pool of water that had gathered in a hole. When asked by Augustine what was happening, the child replied, "I am emptying the ocean into this pool."

"Impossible!" Augustine pronounced.

The child, apparently unawed by the learned theologian, replied, "I'll empty the ocean into this pool before you manage to understand and explain the mystery of the Trinity!"

The legend concludes with Augustine turning around, only to find the child had disappeared. So Augustine was left alone with the mystery of the Trinity.

And in many ways, so are we.
