About the bulletin cover

The west facade of Bath Abbey includes two ladders, one on either side of the great stained glass window. On the ladders are sculpted angels. Some are crawling up the ladder to heaven, others are crawling down the ladder (head first!), bringing God's messages to earth. This completely unique design was supposedly inspired by the Bishop who saw the ladder in a dream. He believed the location was still a holy place and should have a new cathedral rather than the decaying building currently on the site. THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

July 24, 1955: George W. Hensley, founder of a Pentecostal snake handling movement in Appalachia is bitten, refuses treatment as with previous bites, and dies the next day, aged seventy-five. Snake handlers believe that Mark 16:17-18 is to be embraced literally by all Christians.

July 28, 1540: Protestant reformer Thomas Cromwell, for many years the chief advisor to King Henry VIII, is executed at Tower Hill after refusing to support Henry's divorce against Anne of Cleves. The charge is "betraying the crown."

July 29, 1974: Fifteen hundred people crowd the sanctuary of the Episcopal Church of the Advocate in Philadelphia to witness the illegitimate "ordination" of eleven women in defiance of Episcopalian policy. However, the General Convention of the Episcopal Church will approve the ordination of women a few years later.
