THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

August 14, 1882: James Strong was born in New York City. Strong became a seminary professor after ill health caused him to abandon the study of medicine. Though he published many Biblical writings, he is best known for Strong's Exhaustive Concordance of the Bible. It took Strong 35 years to compile his concordance. He assigned each Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek root a number which allowed its every use to be tracked through the Bible. Published in 1890, Strong's is still in print and available online.

August 16, 1642: John Campanius sails from Stockholm with his family to minister in Delaware. There he will learn the Lenni Lenape tongue and translate religious works into it, keep weather records, and consecrate the first Lutheran church built in the new world.

August 18, 1877: Founding of Limestone Presbyterian Church in Gaffney, SC. The City of Gaffney was only three years old when a few faithful Presbyterians in the community decided to request of the South Carolina Presbytery that a church be founded here.
