THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

September 10, 1067: Death of Lady Godgifu (Godiva) Buckingham, an Anglo-Saxon noblewoman and Christian, known for founding several monasteries. She had allegedly ridden through town naked (after requesting her people to close their doors and cover their windows) because it was the only way her husband would agree to relieve oppressive taxes on his people.

September 13, 1541: John Calvin receives an uproarious welcome on his return to Geneva, Switzerland, whose authorities had banished him three years earlier.

September 15, 1963: A racially motivated bombing kills four African-American girls at the 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama. Ironically, the sermon that day was to be "The Love That Forgives," based on Matthew 5:43-44

"When I see the blood, I will pass over you," God says (12:13). This statement leads us to think of another story where the word "see" plays a decisive role. When Abraham is commanded to offer up his son Isaac, he leaves for "the land of Moriah" (Genesis 22:2). The name "Moriah" can be explained as a combination of the Hebrew words for "the Lord" and "see." When Isaac asks, "Where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" he receives the answer, "God himself will provide the lamb" (Genesis 22:7-8, 14): literally, "God will see for himself the lamb."
