THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

January 23, 1893: Death of Phillips Brooks. Though best known as the author of "O Little Town of Bethlehem," Brooks was an eloquent preacher. He served Trinity Church (Episcopal) in Boston and was a staunch defender of the Trinity at a time when Unitarianism was a rising force in New England.

January 25, 98: Trajan becomes Emperor of Rome. Trajan was the adopted son of the Emperor Nerva, who had ended the persecution of Jews and Christians in the Roman Empire. Trajan, who entered Rome with humility, was generally considered a noble-minded and effective emperor. He wrote to Pliny the Younger about how to deal with the Christians in the empire. This is one of the earliest recorded mentions of Christians. Trajan did not perpetuate persecution on the scale of Domitian and other emperors, but he did execute several Christian leaders including Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch, and Simeon, Bishop of Jerusalem.
