THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

January 10, 1514: Publication of the first printed *polyglot* (many languages) Bible in Acala, Spain. The *Complutesian Polyglot*, paid for by Cardinal Ximenez, the Inquisitor of Spain, was compiled by Diego Lopez de Zunga. The Old Testament ran to four volumes. Jerome's Latin *Vulgate* was sandwiched between the Hebrew text and the *Septuagint* (the Greek version of the Old Testament). For the Pentateuch (the five books of Moses) the arrangers also provided an Aramaic translation. In a preface, Ximenez said he hoped the polyglot would assist scholars to determine the correct interpretation of Scripture and argued that while the "meaning of heavenly wisdom" can be found in any language, the true meaning of Scripture cannot "be understood in any way other than from the very fount of the original language."

January 13, 1547: The Council of Trent approved a decree on justification (how God puts us back in right relationship when we have sinned). The Council, organized to be an answer to Martin Luther and the rise of Protestantism, condemned heresies and announced major declarations and explanations of the Church's creed and teachings. The Council gathered for 25 sessions between December 1545 and December 1563. During its discussions, the Council made the Vulgate the official example of the Biblical canon and authorized the creation of a standard version. In 1565, a year after the Council concluded, Pius IV announced the Tridentine Creed and his heir Pius V then issued the Roman Catechism and updates of the Breviary and Missal. These then led to the codification of the Tridentine Mass, which continued as the Church's main method of the Mass for the following four hundred years.


