THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

March 17, 1734: Forty-two families of German Protestant refugees landed in the American colonies. Sponsored by the British Society for the Promotion of Christian Knowledge (SPCK), the 78 religious pilgrims soon founded the town of Ebenezer, 30 miles from Savannah, GA.

March 17, 1897: Emilie Grace Briggs became the first woman in America to graduate from a Presbyterian theological school, when she received her Bachelor of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary, in New York City. She was a daughter of Presbyterian minister Charles A. Briggs, who was suspended by the General Assembly for certain alleged heretical and unorthodox teachings, but who was still a Professor in the seminary.

March 18, 1314: Jacques deMolay, last Grand Master of the Knights Templar, and 38 other French Knights Templars were burned at the stake in Paris. Most church history experts agree that these and other hostilities shown against the Knights Templars were caused by the greed and cunning of Philip the Fair, who sought the great wealth this medieval military religious order had amassed in the centuries following the Crusades.
