THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY

January 19, 825: Vikings wipe out the monastery on the Isle of Iona. They allow its monks to celebrate mass before slaying them.

January 19, 1563: Reformed scholars issue the first full edition of the Heidelberg Catechism, a Calvinist statement of faith written by Peter Ursinus and Caspar Olevianus. It will soon be accepted by nearly all of the Reformed churches in Europe.

January 19, 1922: The Hymn Society of America is formed to improve the music and poetry of Protestant hymns and write new hymns relevant to contemporary life.
